We have all been affected by the higher cost of electricity. What has happened, is that SVE is a bulk user and the higher the usage the higher scale it falls into – so the charges fluctuate as per the usage on the main meter outside. Those charges / calculations are then taken in conjunction with each unit's individual meter readings and worked out accordingly.

The managing agent does not determine the council charges. They are checked every month by the finance trustee in comparison with the council account, and billings are strictly billed in accordance with those received from the council.

You will remember when responsibility was transferred from the Body Corporate to the individual owner.
